



The 2009 Carson-Newman football season marks Head Coach Ken Sparks' 30th campaign at Mossy Creek. Like every Eagle team since 1983 (C-N's first national title), C-N faces sky-high expectations, including a unanimous preseason top-ten ranking and the top spot in the South Atlantic Conference Preseason Coaches' Poll.

Schedule

No team in the country opens with two tougher road games than the Eagles. C-N kicks off the year on Aug. 27 with a first-ever road trip to Winona, Minn. to face Winona State University. The Warriors are one of the winningest programs (10th) of the 2000's.

The Eagles follow with a trip to Florence, Ala. to face three-time national champion and '08 national semifinalist North Alabama. UNA's home field, Braly Municipal Stadium, is home to the Division II National Championship Game.

Carson-Newman opens the home portion of its schedule on Sept. 10 with a Thursday night affair against Campbellsville in Burke-Tarr Stadium.

The date begins a three-game home stand for Eagles, their first since 2002. A first-ever meeting with UNC Pembroke (Sept. 19), who was 9-1 last season, and C-N's South Atlantic Conference opener with Newberry (Sept. 26) complete the home stand.

Nationally-ranked Catawba visits Mossy Creek for homecoming on Oct. 10 and a regular-season finale with Tusculum (Nov. 7) highlight the rest of the Eagles' home schedule. C-N also hosts Brevard in SAC play on Oct. 24.

October road trips to Mars Hill (Oct. 3), to Lenoir-Rhyne (Oct. 17), and to Wingate (Oct. 31) on Halloween complete the Eagles' SAC schedule.

Offense

Offensive coordinator Mike Turner and the Eagles return six starters and four All-South Atlantic Conference performers on offense for 2009.

Last season, the Eagles were as explosive as any offense in the country. C-N led the nation in rushing offense (310 yards per game) and finished sixth nationally in scoring offense (40.6 points per game). The Eagles also finished in the top ten nationally in passing efficiency (6th) and total offense (5th), leading the SAC in all four categories.

Quarterbacks

Senior quarterback Alex Good returns for his final season at Mossy Creek. A four-year starter and two-time All-SAC selection, Good has steered the Eagles to back-to-back SAC titles and a playoff appearance in '08, C-N's first in four years.

The Greensboro, N.C. native is C-N's career-leading rusher for quarterbacks with 1,828 yards, and is fourth in school history in total offense with 4,741 career yards. Three times last season he rushed for over 100 yards, including a 207-yard performance in the Eagles overtime loss at Newberry.

Junior Doug Belk will likely be the backup to Good as the season opens. The Valdosta, Ga. native spent most of his freshman season under center, completing 10-of-15 passes for 149 yards and a touchdown, before moving to receiver as a sophomore.

Running Backs

Seniors Buck Wakefield and Ricky Harris will anchor a deep and proven Eagle backfield.

Along with Good (83.4 yards per game, 46th), Wakefield finished the year in the nation's top 50 in rushing yards per game last season at 86.2 (42nd). The first-team All-SAC selection has 30 career rushing touchdowns, and carried the Eagles in a 35-33 win over Wingate last season with a 223-yard, four-TD performance.

Harris is likely to open the season as Wakefield's split-back mate. The second team All-SAC selection native was slowed by injury during his junior season, but still averaged over seven yards per carry and scored two touchdowns.

Sophomores Nate Inman, Reggie Melton, and Otis Rumph will all see significant playing time, and come push the apparent starters. The three combined to rush for over 400 yards and five TDs last season.

Wide Receivers

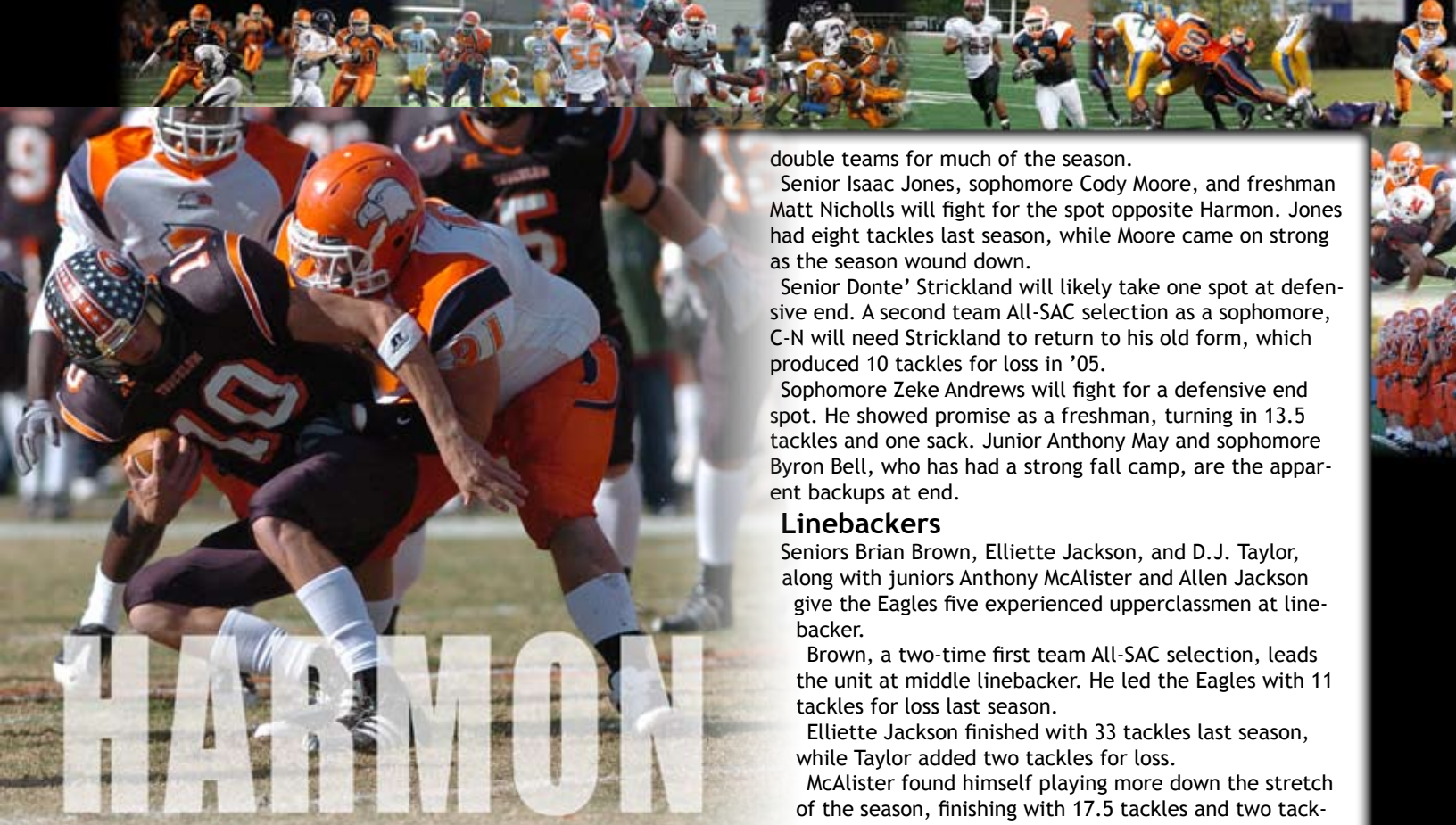
Two-time first team All-SAC selection Reggie Hubbard returns to lead a group of talented, but unproven Eagle receivers. Hubbard led the Eagles with seven TD receptions and a 23.1 yard per reception average in '08. The Chattanooga, Tenn. native is third in school history with 17 career TD receptions.

Competing for the opening across from Hubbard is senior Charles Dobson and sophomore Marcus Huie, along with a slew of returners including Caleb Cornett, Joe Cadle, and Landon McCalmon.

Offensive Line

After battling through an '08 season filled with injuries, C-N returns an experienced core along offensive line. Four Eagles return that starts on last season's squad that paved the way for the Eagles to lead the nation in rushing, led by senior guard Shane Canterbury (6'7, 315).

First Team All-SAC selection Ross Shaffer will push for the spot at right tackle after missing '08 with a knee injury. Junior



Zach Hubbard, who also battled injuries last season, will push Shaffer for the spot or could move to left guard.

Senior Tilmon Hollingshed, who has shuffled positions throughout his career, started eight games last season at tackle, but will move to center for his final season.

On the left side of the line, the Eagles must replace All-American Thomas Battle at guard.

Junior Michael Tribue, who came on strong at the end of the year and had a solid spring, will push to take the job at left tackle. Junior Adam Baxter and a number of freshmen will also see time.

Tight Ends

Senior LeBron Caffey makes the move tight end after three seasons as a defensive end for the Eagles. Fellow senior Ayrus Gaines and transfer Rob Zalucki will push for the spot with Caffey. Matt Cox and Stephen Via, both of whom played significant snaps last season, give the Eagles as many as five options in replacing three-year starter Mo Whitten.

Defense

Longtime defensive coordinator Jim Deaton returns for his third stint at Mossy Creek in '09, and he isn't the only familiar face returning to alma mater. Former All-American linebacker Mike Clowney joined Sparks' staff in the spring as Assistant Head Coach.

Deaton and Clowney inherit an Eagle defense with experience and proven playmakers that will need questions answered along the defensive line and in the secondary if it going to become a complete unit.

Defensive Line

First Team All-South Atlantic Conference selection Brandon Harmon will anchor the Eagles defense from his tackle spot. He finished '09 with five tackles for loss after fighting though

double teams for much of the season.

Senior Isaac Jones, sophomore Cody Moore, and freshman Matt Nicholls will fight for the spot opposite Harmon. Jones had eight tackles last season, while Moore came on strong as the season wound down.

Senior Donte' Strickland will likely take one spot at defensive end. A second team All-SAC selection as a sophomore, C-N will need Strickland to return to his old form, which produced 10 tackles for loss in '05.

Sophomore Zeke Andrews will fight for a defensive end spot. He showed promise as a freshman, turning in 13.5 tackles and one sack. Junior Anthony May and sophomore Byron Bell, who has had a strong fall camp, are the apparent backups at end.

Linebackers

Seniors Brian Brown, Elliette Jackson, and D.J. Taylor, along with juniors Anthony McAlister and Allen Jackson give the Eagles five experienced upperclassmen at linebacker.

Brown, a two-time first team All-SAC selection, leads the unit at middle linebacker. He led the Eagles with 11 tackles for loss last season.

Elliette Jackson finished with 33 tackles last season, while Taylor added two tackles for loss.

McAlister found himself playing more down the stretch of the season, finishing with 17.5 tackles and two tackles for loss. Allen Jackson added six stops on the season.

Sophomore Ryan Helton, who played running back as a freshman, is also in the mix for a spot on the two-deep.

Secondary

Senior safety and All-American candidate Denares Waites returns for his senior season after missing 2009 with a wrist injury. Waites, who has four career interceptions, will move to strong safety, leaving room for junior first team All-SAC selection Mario Russell to patrol the middle of the field. Russell had two interceptions last season, including a 37-yard return for a touchdown on the opening play against Bentley.

Junior Elliott Tarplin, along with sophomores Blaine Ruttan and Elmore Maiden, who had nine tackles last season, will give the Eagles some depth behind Waites and Russell.

Seniors Jermel Demps and P.J. Woods will fight for the starting spots at cornerback. Sophomore Dontaye Hall and junior Tim Stewart could both be factors.

Special Teams

Second Team All-SAC selections Chris Jones and Reggie Hubbard give the Eagles a pair of proven playmakers on special teams.

Jones, a two-time All-SAC selection at punter, returns for his junior season. He averaged 38.5 yards per punt as a sophomore, which is misleading, since nearly half (17) of his 41 kicks were downed inside the 20-yard line.

Hubbard averaged 11.5 yards per punt return last season, and had a 70-yard touchdown return against Mars Hill. He also averaged 20.5 yards per kickoff return.

Buck Wakefield will join Hubbard on both kick return teams. He had a 60-yard punt return as a freshman for a touchdown, and an 80-yard kickoff return against Concord on the first play of '08.

Junior Anthony McAlister will handle the long-snapping duties again this season, while sophomore Carlos Lopez, who made 1-of-4 field goal attempts last season, will fight sophomore David Hendrickson and freshman Chandler Oppenheim for the placekicking duties.

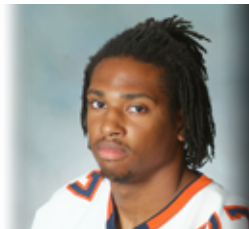
